## APRIL ROAD REPORT

One more slap from Mother Nature as she laid down nearly a foot of wet and heavy snow on 4/13. Previous to that our last plowing of snow had been on 3/6.

Weight limit signs were taken down on 4/30 along with the rest of the snow mobile crossing signs.

Our 3<sup>rd</sup> and last phase of the road sign replacement project has been received. The signs will be put up by early fall.

Christmas banners/lights were taken down and the appropriate seasonal banners installed.

The sweeping of town roads has been started.

The John Deere 6330 tractor was readied for shipment and has been delivered to SERWE IMPLEMENTS to have the boom arm mower installed.

At the Transfer Station, appropriate signage needs to be made up dictating brush drop off criteria such as sizes, lengths and cleanliness of material. Along with warnings of fines. Also new signage needs to be made up for our Metal and "Demo" dumpsters. The paper ones just don't cut it.

A safety check on all of our Playground apparatuses has been completed.

Two collapsible sneeze guards were fabricated for our towns election personnel.

The road department still has their hat in the ring regarding the use of the existing Fire Department once it is vacated. As it is now our shop and storage areas are filled to the brim. Extra space would give a much less cumbersome working area. And also in doing so, and if this happens the Community Garden can have total use of the "Baseball Hut" adjacent to the garden.
